Date: 22nd December -28th December 2019

First Day 22/12/2019 (Sunday)

The first day of NSS camp commenced on 22/12/2019 Sunday by 3.30 pm at Carmel CMI Public School Carmel Hills Puliyanmala. It began with official inauguration.
