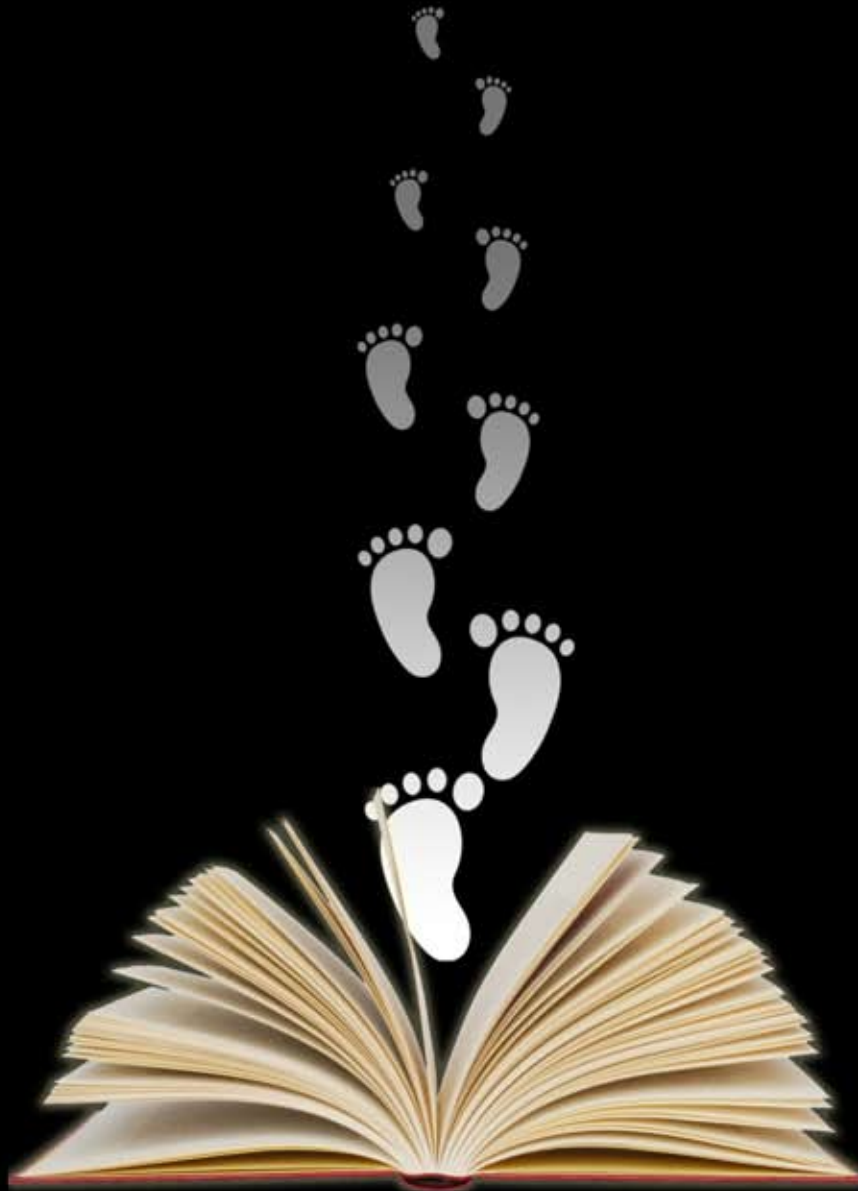

Christ College is a centre for higher education, situated on the cardamom hills of Puliyanmala, Idukki. It is yet another milestone in the fabulous history of the CMI Congregation. The college has become one of the leading centers of higher education in Idukki district, in a flash of time. Christ College, Puliyanmala is remarkable for its extraordinarily eco- friendly campus blessed with cool fresh air and occasional thin layers of snowflakes. The infrastructure is well advanced. The cool premises are capable of filling young minds with refreshed energy ceaselessly.

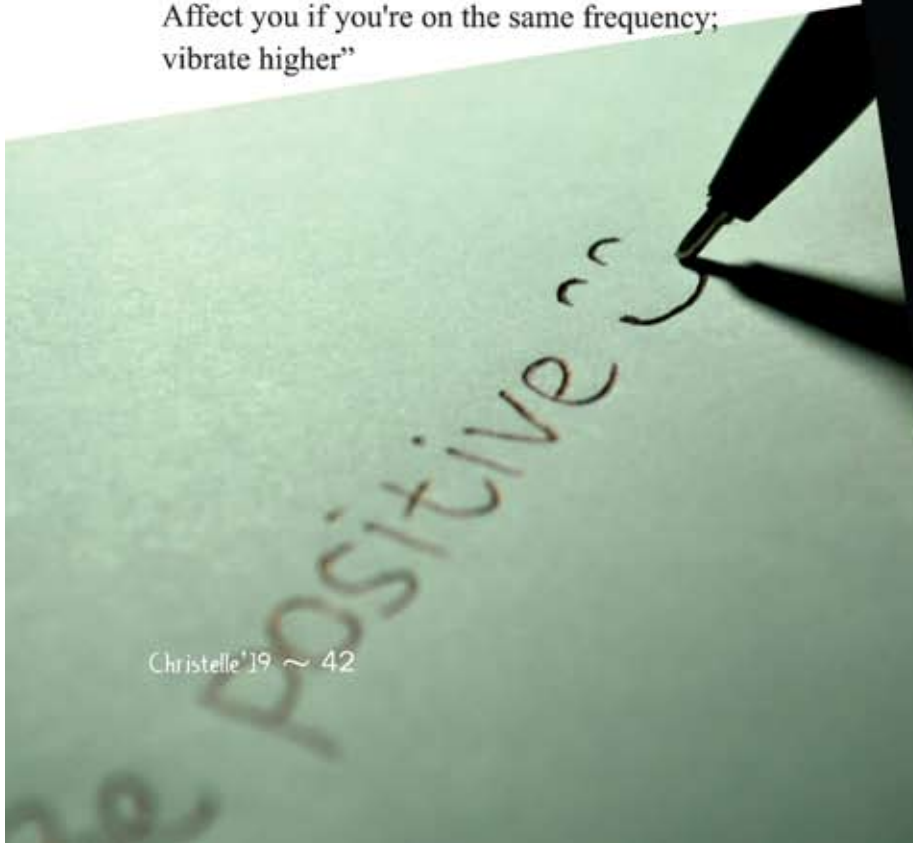

DIAGNOSIS IS IMPORTANT

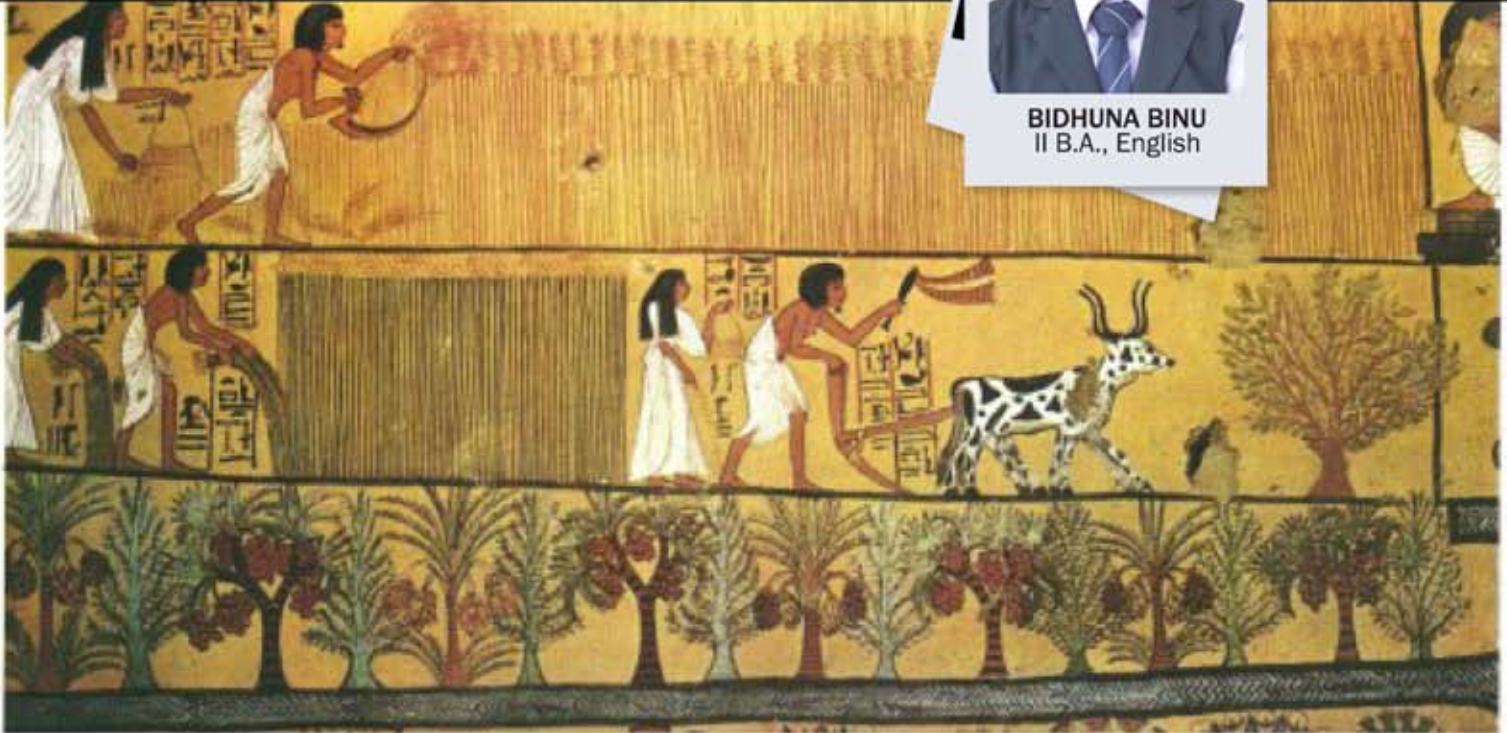

FALL OF RUPEE

A major threat currently faced by the Indian economy is the drastic down-slide of rupee value against US Dollar. The value of rupee has just collapsed to an all time record of 74.33 in October 2018. There are 3 crucial factors that dragged down the value of INR. The Central Government is very keen on building a better relationship with United States of America and the Government strives hard to be a better ally of USA. With the advent of Trump's government in US, the international policies concerning Middle East were amended and all its allies were asked to end oil imports from Iran. Henceforth India had to find another source for crude oil. Due to the embargo and decreased supply of oil, the price was hiked in a significant manner. As India is world's 3rd largest oil importer, an increase in global oil prices will inflate the import bill and disrupt the financial position. This has led to high deficit which means the country has to sell rupees and buy dollars to pay its bill. Thus the value of rupee has fallen.

Another element dragging down the value of rupee is the on-going trade war between US and China. The trade war between these two economic superpowers has reached an extreme edge followed by America's threat of imposing an embargo on Chinese goods. As a counter attack, China threatens US by imposing additional tariffs on US products. This increased tension in the global stock exchanges has consequently accelerated the sales on domestic bourses. This eventually induced a severe decline in the value of INR.

And the third factor is the growth of US economy. A massive growth is experienced in the US economy and subsequently US Dollar is getting stronger day by day. It is not just INR, but the currencies of almost all developing nations are degrading against USD.

Rupee can be strengthened up to an extent if Indian government rethinks on its oil import policy. However the other two factors are external in nature and therefore can't be controlled.
