
OBJECTIVES

MORAL CLASS AND HOLY MASS, FEBRUARY 2015





July 2017

Moral class for the month of July commenced on 12th July, 2017. Ms, Anithamol C S led the class and the students had a session on 'Humility and modesty'. A lack of humility and modesty can lead to self-hatred and to the very rejection of one's own existence, while the more appropriate path must lead to the full acceptance of existence as a whole. For the catholic students, holy mass and confession was arranged on the same day.

November 2017

The moral classes came to an end by February. The moral classes proved to be an important factor in the personal formation of our students.







